10:45 – 10:58	<b>Portugal: A more close look, by Victor Santos. National contribution to FEANTSA's Annual Theme 2009.</b> The video tells the story of the former service user Joe who was able to overcome his drug addiction and find a job and housing with the support of homeless services in Lisbon.
11:00 – 11:21	<b>Denmark: Ikke I Min Baggård (Not in my backyard), Rune Gaustad, Balder Film, 2004.</b> On December 22, 2000 a new community was set up at the fringes of society in Copenhagen. This anarchic movement emerged following the presence of many homeless people in open public spaces and the frustration about the government's bureaucratic way of dealing with socially excluded people. The new community consisted of twelve second hand, rusty caravans that provided accommodation and a new life for 16 homeless people in Copenhagen.
11:23 – 11:34	<b>Wales: Ty Gobaith, Annual Review 2008, The Salvation Army. [Extracts]</b> This video presents the homeless services of the Salvation Army in Cardiff, Wales. The video deals in particular with the "Bridge" programme, a detox and reintegration programme for people with drug and alcohol addiction.
11:36 – 11:42	<b>Netherlands: Young Voices 2 Be Heard. [Extracts]</b> Young homeless people talk about their views on participation.
11:44– 11:56	<b>Belgium: Fami Home, Projet d'accès direct de la rue à l'habitation solidaire (in French only). [Extracts]</b> The video presents a housing project for rough sleepers in Brussels, Belgium. People are living in flat shares (logement solidaire) and continue to receive support from social workers. The residents of an apartment define their own rules of living together.
11:58- 12:14	<b>Poland: National contribution, 2009.</b> FEANTSA members in Poland present examples of participation in Poland.
12:16 – 12:31	<b>Finland: National contribution, 2009.</b> The Finnish video is about the participation of homeless people in an experience research education programme. The participants talk about their views and experiences with the programme.
12:33 – 12:36	<b>Lithuania: Participation of homeless people in Lithuania, Caritas Vilnius, 2009</b> The video shows the homeless services of Caritas Vilnius. Only simple forms of participation exist so far.
12:38 – 12:49	<b>UK (Scotland): The Comments Box, Glasgow Homelessness Network, 2009.</b> The video presents the "comments box " as a tool for participation in homeless services.
12:51- 13:07	<b>Czech Republic: Permanent Residence Prague, Documentary by Ivo Bystrican, SAMU 2008. [Extracts]</b> The video contrasts extracts from an interview with the Mayor of Prague and police interventions towards homeless people with the living experiences of rough sleepers in Prague.
13:09 – 13:24	<b>FEANTSA video: Interviews with EU decision makers on homelessness, 2009 (in French with English subtitles).</b> Four service users from the Relais Social Charleroi in Belgium conducted interviews with three European decision makers for FEANTSA. They talked about the role of the EU in combating homelessness, participation of service users and the experience of homelessness. This video brings together extracts from the interviews with Philippe Courard, State Secretary for Social Integration and the Fight against Poverty, Belgium, Isabelle Durant, Member and Vice President of the European Parliament and Jérôme Vignon, European Commission.
13:25– 13:33	<b>Denmark: SAND, 2009</b> The video is from and about SAND, the Danish national service user organisation. The video

	presents this year's project days, an example of directly involving the users on a political level in relation to the national homelessness strategy, and the Council for socially marginalised people. It also includes interviews with members and their views on SAND and the future of the organisation.
<b>13:35 – 13:52</b>	<b>Hungary: AHA drama group, 2009.</b> This video is about the AHA Drama Group, the only homeless theatre in Hungary. The video presents the life and achievements of the group and the thoughts of its members. In addition to the interviews, you can see some amateur video recordings made earlier.
<b>13:55 – 14:13</b>	<b>Spain: The Road to Participation, FEANTSA Spain, 2009. [Extracts]</b> The video is a collection of different participation experiences from FEANTSA members in Spain.
<b>14:15 – 14:35</b>	<b>Italy: “Avrò cura di me: Appunti da un viaggio nelle pratiche di partecipazione delle persone senza dimora” (I'll take care of me: Notes from a trip through practices of participation of homeless people), fio.PSD, 2009. [Extracts]</b> The video was produced in collaboration with "Telestrada", the first web based TV station. The editorial team consisted of homeless people. The documentary presents good practice examples of participation within some members of our Federation (Association Massoero 2000 in Genoa, New Hotel Opera Bonomelli People of Bergamo, Penelope Associazione of Messina, Associazione Amici di Piazza Grande di Bologna). With the creation of the video, fioPSD decided to open a reflection group on participation, consisting of service providers and severely socially excluded people. The group will submit a preliminary report in 2010 on various models of participation and strategies for participation, and therefore welfare, for homeless people.
<b>14:37- 14:50</b>	<b>Belgium: Parlons-en ou cause toujours? Le débat, qu'est-ce qu'on y gagne quand on est à la rue ?, arpenteurs/Alpes Presse, 2008 (in French only) [Extracts]</b> Every month, service users and social workers come together at the Relais Social Charleroi and talk about conflicts and issues that arise. This forum is called "Parlons-en" (Let's talk about it!)
<b>14:52 – 14:59</b>	<b>UK (Northern Ireland): Going home, Youth Unit of the Council for the homeless Northern Ireland (CNHI).</b> The Youth Unit of the CNHI interviewed 45 young homeless people throughout the country to talk about barriers to housing and their views on possible solutions to youth homelessness.
<b>15:01 – 15:11</b>	<b>Belgium (Flanders): The Homeless World Cup, Episode 2, 2009. [Extracts]</b> In 2007 a small group of Antwerp social workers decided to organise a Belgian team for the Homeless World Cup in Melbourne 2008. It was a phenomenal success and a TV programme was made which run on Flemish TV from 6 – 26 May 2009. The TV series generated lots of interest, with 25% of Flemish families watching it every week. FEANTSA has the exclusive right to show the second episode of the programme at this conference.
<b>15:13 – 15:23</b>	<b>Germany: National contribution, 2009.</b> Interviews with service users in the St Ursula Heim in Offenburg.
<b>15:25 – 15:31</b>	<b>Ireland : Focus Ireland Customer Participation.</b> The video is about service user involvement in Focus Ireland services.
<b>15:35 – 16:00</b>	<b>Norway: Med Himmelen Som Talk, Film by Rune Gaustad, Balder Film, 2008.</b> The film is about moving to a new home after years of homelessness and living on the streets. The film takes the perspective of the inhabitants and shows how a new home alters your life both physically and mentally. The film aims to encourage a debate that will hopefully lead to an improvement of Norway's housing problems.
<b>16:02- 16:12</b>	<b>Denmark: “The Line”, Jens Arntzen, 2009.</b> Artistic representation of homelessness and exclusion.
