Site Visits - Budapest 20 September 2018

1 Dózsa György Street Hostel and Departments – 20 minutes from CEU (https://goo.gl/maps/QsBh1crRo2r)

The Dózsa Hostel and its departments is the largest institution in Budapest. The hostel has 312 single and 7 double rooms for women, men and couples. The night shelter offers three different accommodation types for women: the crisis night shelter accommodates up to 95 women in 6 rooms, the 24 hours crisis shelter for women accommodates up to 40 women in 5 rooms who have not been homeless before, are young or over 50 and close to retirement, pregnant or employed. The third category shelter serves as waiting "room" for 26 women and men for the hostel who are housed in single rooms (people have to commit to compulsory savings of 5000 HUF per month). The Origóc day centre offers bathing, cooking and washing facilities. The Job Centre helps people find employment and training opportunities. 2 Szabolcs Street Health Centre (app. 35 minutes from CEU)

The Szabolcs Street Health Centre offers 50 in-patient care beds for elderly homeless people and 23 therapy beds for homeless people. The GP service runs 24 hours. Recovery beds (15+3) are reserved for rough sleeping homeless people to ensure proper medication, shelter, meals and basic health care. 3 Temporary Accommodation for Families, Rákosszeg park 4 (app. 35 minutes from CEU, https://goo.gl/maps/uQQYrYL6sut)

Three floors in the building offer temporary accommodation for families in 18 furnished apartments for 80 persons (children included). All families are housed in independent units. The aims of the service are on the one hand to

provide temporary refuge and care for families who lost their homes (including single parents with children with DV history), to support keeping children in their families and to prevent putting children in foster care by serving housing and care needs. Single parent families, couples with children, expecting women, or mothers with new born children are equally eligible to apply for placement. Children are offered ECCD services, and a psychologist and lawyers assist the families if needed. Gyáli Hostel provides accommodation for men, women and couples. It especially admits people with a regular income who are willing to take part in a saving scheme of a high amount which is essential for establishing independent housing. The hostel has sunny double rooms, each with a small lobby (with a hot and cold water sink and a refrigerator inside). There are free-time activity groups funded by grants and psychological counselling available. There is also a well-equipped library and a tele-room for residents. HKA is also responsible for running FEAD programs in Hungary.

The walk will show you the daily routines of Dodi, a man who used to be a rough sleeper for many years. The tour will end at the 24-hour dispatch-centre of the capital, which is responsible for the coordination of the allocation of people across the providers.

The Miklós Street Shelter offer services which cover all types of services which are available in the Hungarian context (street outreach work, day centre, crisis shelter and night shelter). The institution hosts the headquarters of the mobile pulmonology screening service, which – among others - runs a bus with the necessary equipment to serve vulnerable and homeless people. The aim of the Centre is to offer necessary services in their complexity to respond to the complex needs of homeless people. Beyond being skilled social workers, the employees are devoted to the Maltese mission which means presence, bending down to the needy ones and inclusion.

10 IX. district city development walk ending at BMSZKI Külső Mester Transitory Home (15 minutes from CEU)

The tour covers one of the most interesting areas of Budapest in terms of urban development: a specific part of middle Ferencváros, close to the Danube, with 19th century industrial past, still visible impacts of state socialist housing, economic and urban policies, and spectacular gentrification and function change (from transport/industrial functions towards financial, ICT, cultural services). The walk will present some specific spatial imprints of past decades' political, economic and social developments as well as urban planning. It will specifically address changes in the area's social composition and its relation to housing and urban policy. The walk ends at BMSZKI Külső Mester Transitory Home where participants will meet social workers to learn the everyday work in the shelter.

The first phase of the tour will take you to OIKOS, a 2-apartment hostel for people with addictions, and show you the life int he hostel thorough the eyes of one of the clients and the staff. After this location you will be take a walk to the largest night shelter of the city (five minute walk), and you will become familiar with the admission system and the physical settings which are very problematic, accommodating homeless people with multiple challenges. The shelter houses 140 to 230 men (depending ont he season), admittance is on a first-come-first-served basis. Rooms have 12-20 beds (bunk beds). Admission is every half hour from 18:00 to 7:30. GP is available one day per week. Open on all days.

12 City walk with Iván Tosics: Different models of inner city urban regeneration (15 minutes from CEU)

Neighbouring Budapest districts were subject of the same national legislation, making the sale of public rental buildings compulsory in the early 1990s ("right to buy"). Surprisingly, however, the districts have chosen very different models to deal with the problems of deprived multifamily housing. Needless to say, also the social consequences became starkly different. The walking tour will illustrate these models, ranging from total gentrifying till socially sensitive regeneration, in three Budapest inner city areas (districts 7-8-9).
