






May 2016: Number of Beneficiaries










Division by Institution candidate supplier







Type of accomodation used by the beneficiaries







Delay between the selection of the beneficiary and his/her entrance into accommodation






Information about the target group

- 50% of the young beneficiaries have no contact with their families
- Out of 18 young adults within the project, at least 12 are in debt
- 8 Poly-drug addicts
- None carry a high school degree







Revenue streams of the beneficiaries of the project



Project's benefits for the beneficiaries:

- Social integration by housing first
- Administrative and financial regularization
- Healthcare rights
- Social reintegration via training sessions, employment
- Significant increase of the quality of life
- Increase of self-worth
- Social connections: institutions, friends and family





Obstacles and the difficulties of the project:

- Difficulty in finding housing
- The problems of addictions of the beneficiaries
- The acceptance of care from the beneficiaries
- Lack of financial means of the beneficiaries
- Beneficiaries' feeling of isolation when alone
- The renting damages





Project's Strengths:

- Innovation : When the social urgency is allied to public service. Two institutions specialized in the helping instable/poor persons
- Multidisciplinarity of the teams and the complementarity in the range of services
