We spot places where, at night, we could come and set up our tent in complete tranquility, without worrying about “what will people say” or “look at me.” We take these precautions for the toilets, and from these nighttime needs we make ourselves known to 115 [emergency social services] as our new resting place, to benefit from soup or coffee from the outreach teams at night and during the day.
