Shelter use increased until Covid-19




Emerged from signing the Lisbon Declaration

Initial target: 100 EUR 3000 per unit

Focus on ICT, but mostly working in teams of 2 1 or more home visits per week

Social workers (case management)	5
Social mentors	10

Involvement of municipal project managers In Riga, service provider also conducts apartment search and contracting Additional funding for designers/evaluating researchers

Housing sustainment rate

First clients received apartments at the end of September

46/49 remain housed

- 1 death
- 1 voluntarily ended the service
- 1 contract was ended by service provider
